H-1B - Background

Certain filing fees are considered an employer's expense and not an expense of the H-1B employee. As such, the Department of Labor (DOL) regulations are restrictive on who can pay fees associated with H-1B applications and states that the employee cannot pay for any of the following:

- · Government filing fees;
- Attorney fees (similarly in-house recharge fees should not be paid by the employee);
- Typical business expenses that occur during the H-1B application.

Problem:

- Currently out of compliance with DOL by allowing H-1B employees to incur the fees identified above.
- 2. H-1B employees have paid approximately 10% of filing fees since 2008.

Risk:

- 1. DOL will consider UCR to be a "willful" violator and can subject the university to fines that could run as much as \$100k for each offense.
- 2. DOL will restrict the university from obtaining H-1B visas for an unknown timeframe.

Recommendations:

- Based on conversation with campus counsel, employee relations, and UCOP, UCR must discontinue its current practice effective immediately.
- Communication from the VPIA office of changes in fee structure to campus senior leaders – Chancellor, Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor, and Deans.

Other Recommendations:

- Consider having Colleges/Schools pay for all fees related to an H-1B application. Cost
 of an individual application ranges from \$2875 \$4385* (**). Or
- Consider having Colleges/Schools pay filing fees only, while ISC's service fees/operational costs are provided by central funding. Cost for filing fees range from \$325 - \$2135. Cost for ISC's operational fees derived from each application range from \$1150 - \$2250.

^{*} Fees above are not inclusive of dependent's visa fees. H-1B employees are responsible for fees associated with processing their dependent visa.

^{**} Does not include other visa fees (J-1, TN, green cards etc.)
