Dispatcher Hiring

• Written exam completed, interviews in two weeks

Officer hiring

- ~25 candidates
- Physical test completed
- Pool looks strong
- Looking for volunteers for interview panels—particularly students and faculty

Chief Search Progress

- Updating job description
- New title: Dir. Of Campus Safety Services/Chief of Police
 - Chief title needs to be maintain per municipal ordinances, but primary title is Director of Campus Safety
- Engaging a search firm—The Hawkins Company
- Current timeline—aiming for candidate to start in Fall



- Initial focus groups in March
- Full search launch April

UCR PD Satisfaction Survey

- Police officer's business cards will have QR code for survey and link to campus safety plan
- System-wide effort
- All UCPDs will have business cards and be required to hand them out post-interactions
- Policy manual can be found on website
- Survey results go straight to campus level
- Possible quarterly reviews to analyze survey results

Restorative Justice

- RJ subcommittee has been meeting regularly to formalize partnerships/relationships for diversion programs
- Sub-subcommittee met to discuss framework for diversion program (Chief Frisbee, DDA Cabral, AVC Woods)
 - DDA Cabral's office is developing initial workflow to outline what offenses could be eligible, what program will look like
- Look toward community organizations for assistance, Regina may have connections

AVC Woods and Chief Frisbee met with the city to discuss their efforts, possible partnership opportunities to assist city with research efforts to review same data

• City also looking into tiered response models and will be looking to the University's example
