Opportunities and Challenges of Undergraduate Education

- Opportunities
 - Research universities have a culture of inquiry, creativity, and discovery.
 - An evolution in the perspective of academic success/teaching
 - Raising the profile of high-impact practices

- Challenges
 - Research universities serving fewer Black/Latinx students
 - Six year completion rates are significantly lower for Black/Latinx students
 - Enrollment of Pell-eligible students has decreased

Opportunities and Challenges at UCR

- Steady increase in overall graduation rate
- Black Faculty percentages on par with Black student enrollment (3.9% total)/UIA Black Student Success Initiative
- Significant numbers of URM students (36.1% Chicano/Latinx; 3% Black/African American)
- No. 1, Social Mobility

- Retention and graduation rates, time to degree for FTIC Black and Latinx students
- 2-3 yr. Graduation rates (50%, 78.5%) Black Xfer students,
- Chicano/Latinx faculty (9.8%) far below Chicano/Latinx student enrollment
- Advising support
